

While we are exploring the area we will be using viewfinders to help us to find interesting views and features. Let's look at how to use a viewfinder...



You can use a viewfinder to identify close-up patterns in the environment, such as leaf or brick patterns...



You can also use the viewfinder to pick out patterns from further away, such as field patterns...



You can use a viewfinder to identify interesting features that you see in the environment...



Remember, whatever you see in the viewfinder is exactly what you need to record. Look carefully at the lines, shapes and proportions of the area you are studying within the viewfinder.
